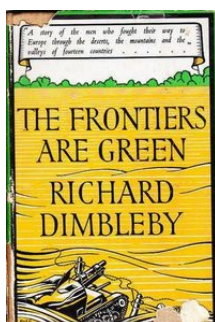


THE FRONTIERS ARE GREEN
