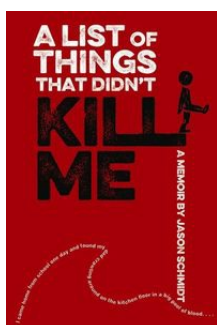


A LIST OF THINGS THAT DIDN'T KILL ME
