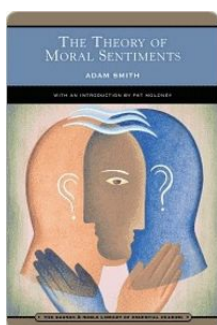


THE THEORY OF MORAL SENTIMENTS
